

Camera Action is much more than a multimedia course—it is a call to action and a safe space for young creatives to explore their talents. In a world where teenagers are often exposed to violence, poverty, and misinformation, this course stands as a beacon of hope. Not only does Camera Action give a voice to the voiceless, but it is also the first course in the Lambeth borough dedicated to teaching multimedia skills to young people.

It is a true honor to be part of this groundbreaking project, which is already uncovering trailblazing talent. This initiative is poised to transform the lives of its students and uplift the entire Portuguese community in the UK.

The course was led by Cristina Cabral, an award-winning filmmaker, lecturer in Diversity and Media and Visual Methods, and a PhD graduate in Cultural Industries from SOAS (University of London). Cristina facilitated both online and in-person sessions and organized workshops featuring industry professionals, providing students with unique work experiences to practice the theory learned in the online classes.





PROJECT OVERVIEW

VISION

Camera Action is an innovative and impactful project that teaches multimedia skills to children of Portuguese descent in Lambeth, London. Designed for children aged 14 to 18, the course began on October 1st and received incredible interest from students originally from Portuguese-speaking countries. The course was fully booked within the first weeks and successfully engaged 10 participants from diverse backgrounds, all passionate about the creative industries.

MISSION

- **Divert Youth from Delinquency:** Engage young people in constructive activities that reduce their exposure to negative influences.
- Foster Talent and Creativity: Encourage self-expression and skill development through film, photography, acting, and other artistic disciplines.
- **Promote Education and Career Readiness:** Equip participants with knowledge and tools to build a brighter future through education and professional development.



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- **Build Positive Connections:** Create a supportive community where young individuals can form meaningful relationships with mentors, peers, and role models.
- **Inspire Social Change:** Use storytelling and media to raise awareness about important issues while empowering youth to be advocates for positive change in their communities.







COURSE STRUCTURE

The course combined hybrid learning with online and in-person sessions:

- Online Classes: Held on Tuesdays, 7 PM to 8 PM, focusing on multimedia theory.
- In-Person Workshops: Conducted at the Portuguese Community Centre, these sessions allowed handson practice of the skills learned online.



The online classes, delivered via Zoom every Tuesday during the school term, were wellattended, with students logging in promptly and engaging enthusiastically with the multimedia topics. In an online environment, audiovisual materials are crucial to maintaining students' interest, and the content was effectively delivered using thematic presentations, videos, quizzes, and practical assignments. These assignments were pivotal in assessing the students' skills and enabling personalised teaching to ensure every participant could benefit fully without feeling disadvantaged.



PRACTICAL EXPERIENCES

• TThe students began pre-production for their first short film, Little Portugal, inspired by the true story of the Portuguese community's migration in the 1980s and 1990s. Highlights included:

Title: Little Portugal Genre: Drama/Community

FADE IN:

EXT. LAMBETH - SOUTH LAMBETH ROAD - DAY - 1985

The streets are thrumming with life. Brightly painted storefronts contrast against the grey London sky. The aromas of PASTRIES, GRILLED MEATS, and COFFEE waft through the air. Three children play soccer on the small stretch of lawn, laughter echoing.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

Some areas of Lambeth in the 80s were ill-advised places—where the remnants of a fading era lingered. But for others, it became home.

CUT TO:

INT. A SMALL, CROWDED CAFE - "ESTRELA" - DAY

The cafe is filled with Portuguese immigrants chatting over cups of "bica" (Portuguese espresso) and beers. Traditional FADO music plays discreetly from a radio. We focus on ILDA (40s), her face weathered yet spirited, serving drinks. She is the owner.

• Location Scouting: A visit to Estrela Tapas restaurant, where students interviewed the owner, Mr. Michael, who warmly welcomed the group. Students enjoyed Portuguese pastries and beverages while gathering insights for their film. During the visit, they applied their skills by taking notes and photos and implementing the knowledge gained in class.









ACHIEVMENTS

Participants showcased remarkable enthusiasm, attending sessions punctually and delivering excellent results despite school commitments. They demonstrated creativity and teamwork, producing impactful projects in podcasting, public speaking, photography, filmmaking, and editing. Three of the students are multi-award-winning creatives:
